- 3. Viewed problems as opportunities


What I find interesting: Is that with a needle and thread and some fabric/ old ripped up clothes, she could make a new style!

Overcame a Hardship/Challenge

Coco was born poor and skinny. Although she was poor, she did not act like it. She had 5 brothers and sisters. Coco was 12 when she was sent to Notre Dame orphanage that had only white material for the beds, walls and uniforms.

I think Coco acted like she had more money because she saw other girls so she acted like them. I think her parents could not take care of 5 kids, so they sent the girls to a orphanage and the boys to a farm. This makes me think of my great grandmother because she had 12 brothers and sisters. Her mom died when she was only 2.

Coco learned to sew out of scraps of fabric, she made rag dolls and ribbons for her hair, and when she was in an orphanage, she made dolls for every girl in the orphanage to make them happy!


This reminds me of Thomas Edison who also changed an invention to make it more useful. He worked on a car engine to make it better.



Viewed Problems as Opportunities

In the early 1900's, the girls and boarding schools had a choice if they wanted a job, such as nursing, tailoring or domestic services. She chose tailoring so she could practice her sewing skills. In 1914 her workshop got very crowded because of the war, and Coco had perfect clothes for war so she was making things very fast.

In the early 1900's most girls didn't have very good jobs or working conditions. So we learned that in 1909 Clara Lemlich lead a strike so the women workers wouldn't work until they got more fair treatment.




Author Talk
