Demonstrated Bravery/Took Action

In 1935 Amelia went flying around the equator and flew 27,000 miles! No one had done that before. Men said she couldn't or she wouldn't do it because they had never done it. Well Amelia did it any ways.

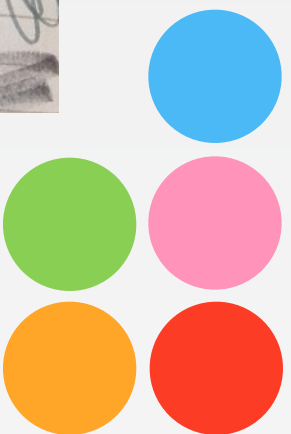
This remind me of a book I read called Brave when a boy did something he'd always wanted to do which was to go on a huge slide and he did.

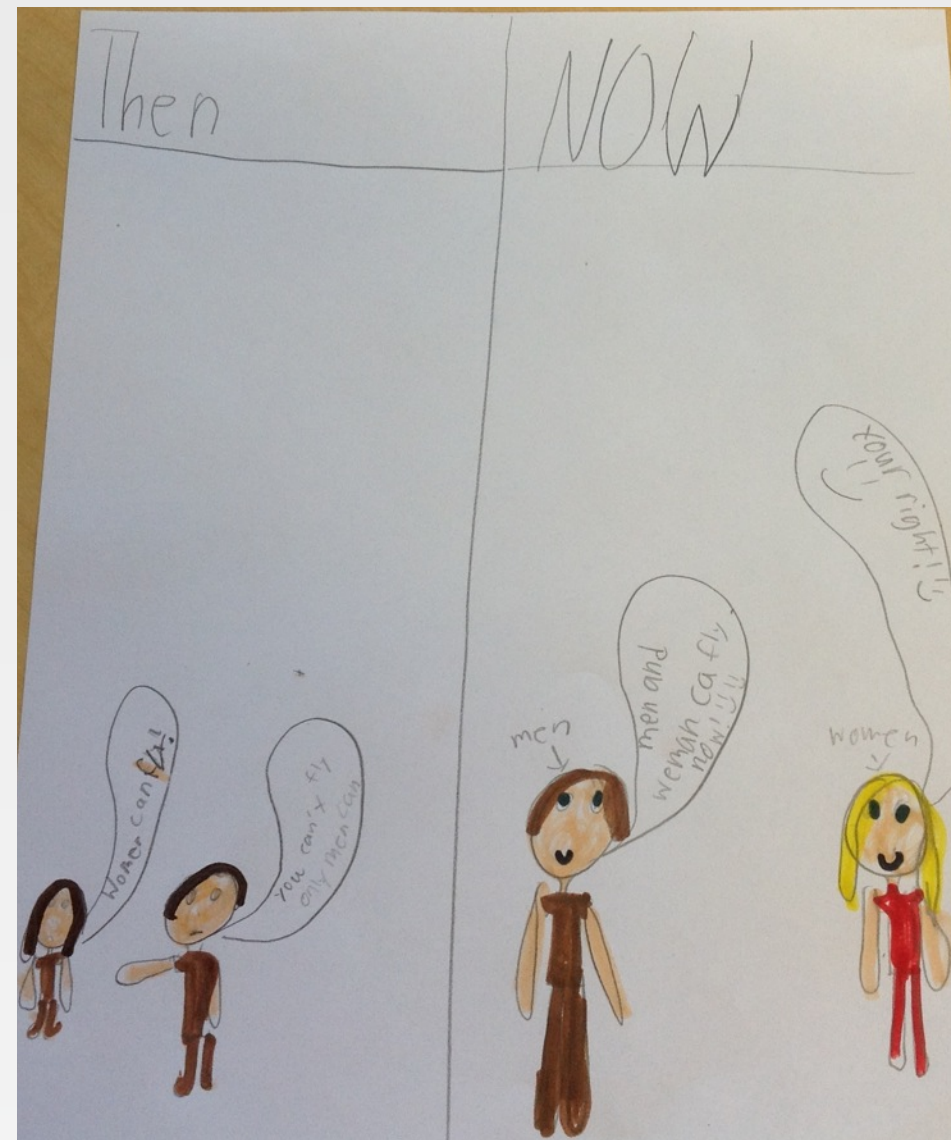
This is like Madam CJ Walker who was determined start her own business and people thought she was doing something wrong. She also invented hair products to help hair grow and people thought that was wrong too!

People use to believe that men could only fly planes. Now men think and women think that both can fly.

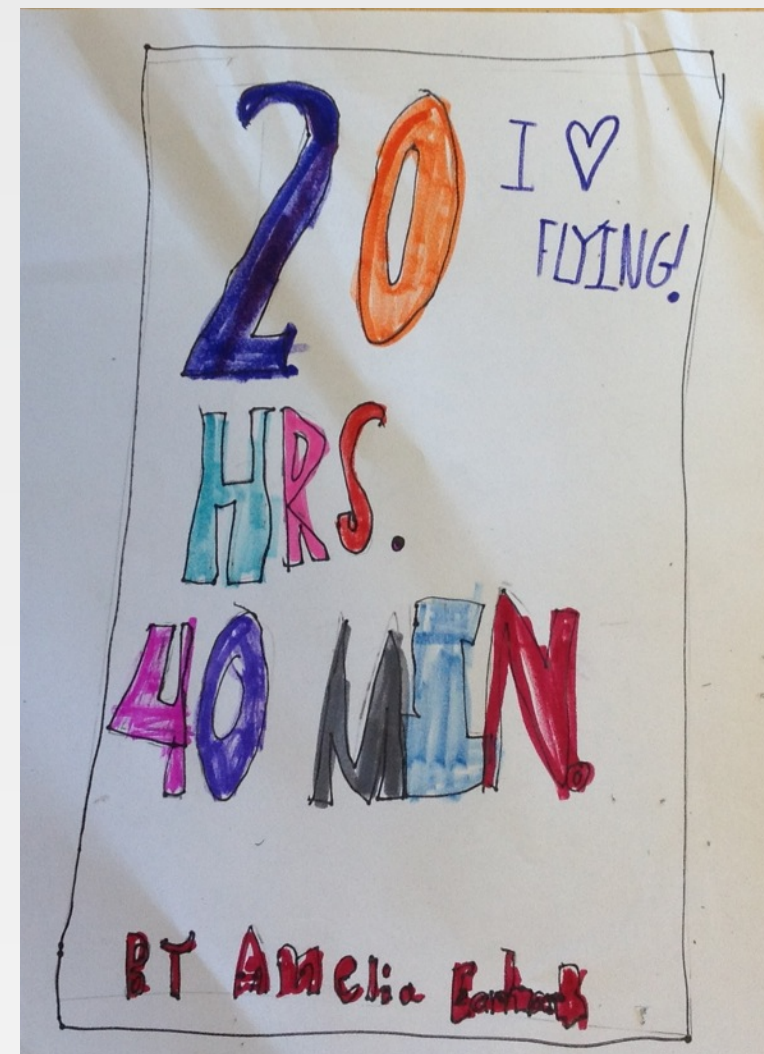
And when I go on flights, I see women pilots. Now men and women should be treated fairly.

Rachel Carson wrote a book called Silent spring. Amelia and Rachel both want to inspire others.

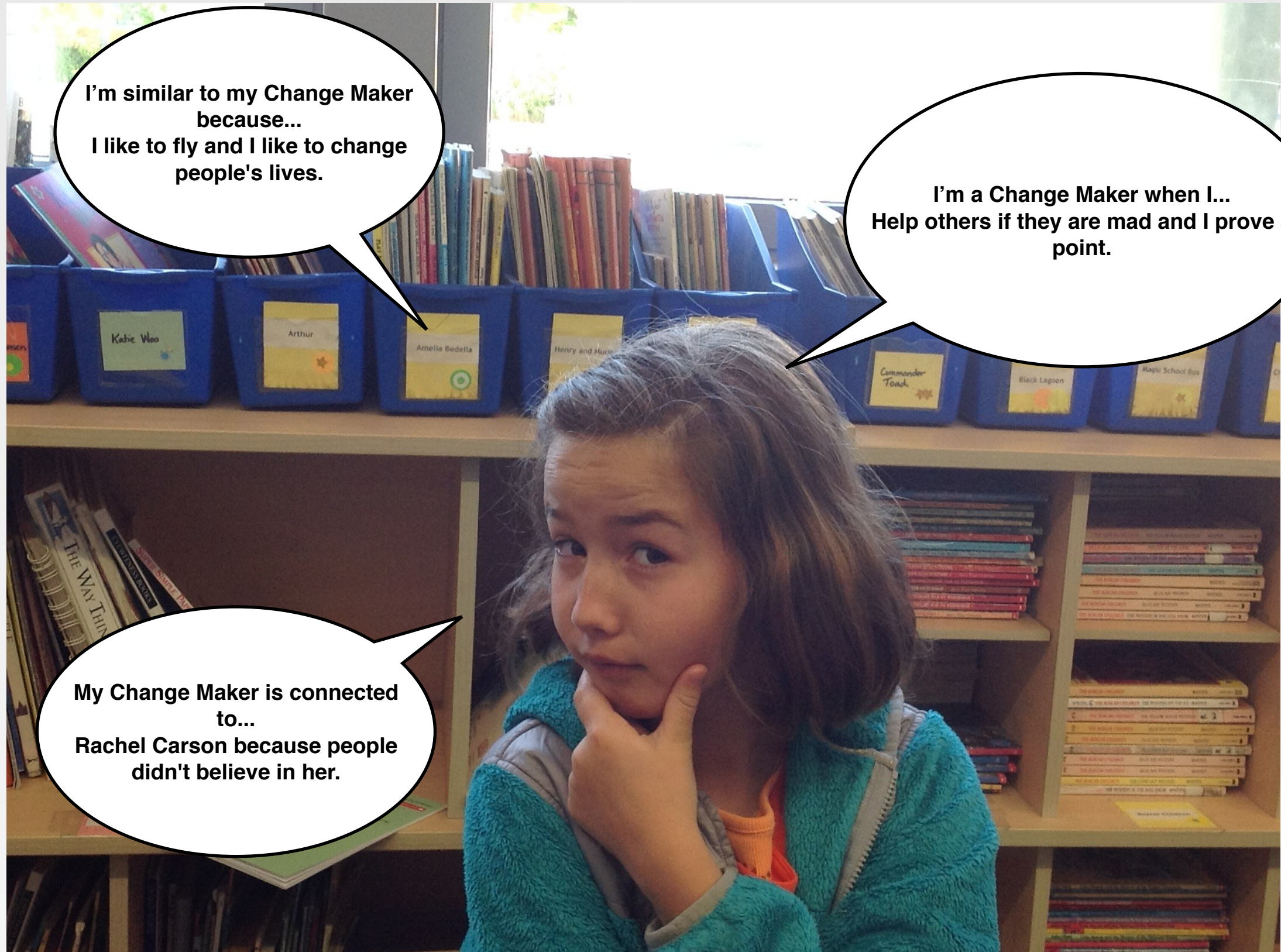


Author Talk

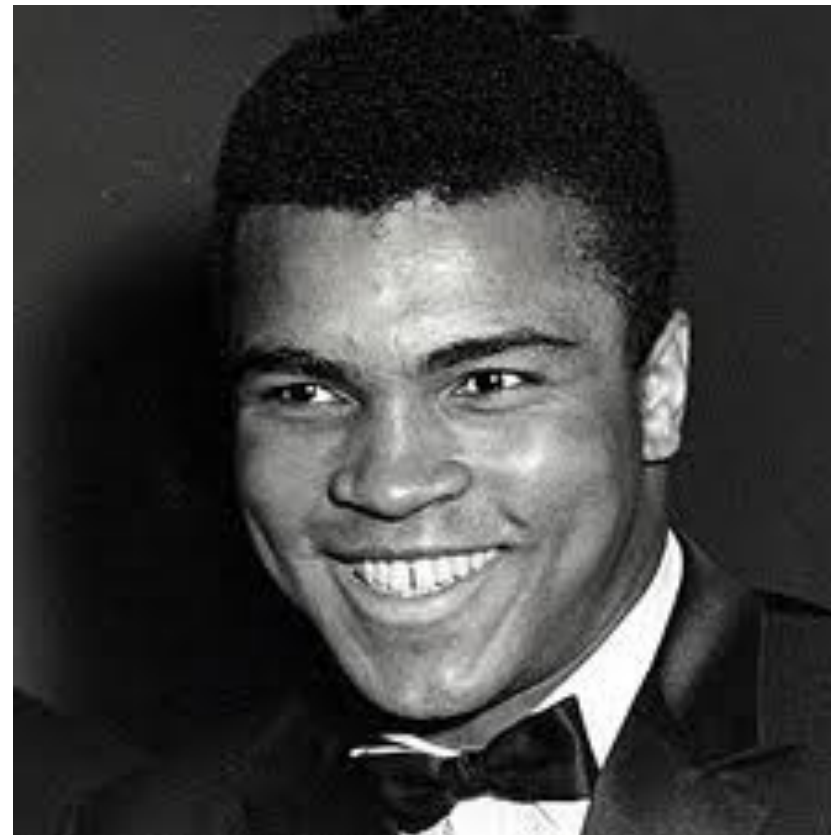
