She named chimps & found out each had a special look and personality.

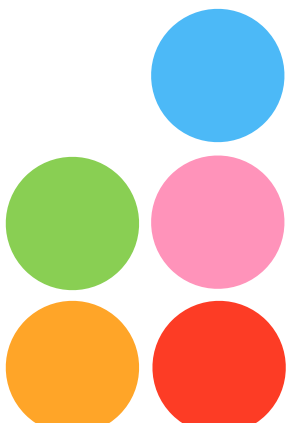
This shows that Jane loves animals because she looked after them and treated them like humans.

Jane worked hard to save money to go to Africa. Jane never gave up on her dream to become an Ethologist, a scientist who studies animals.

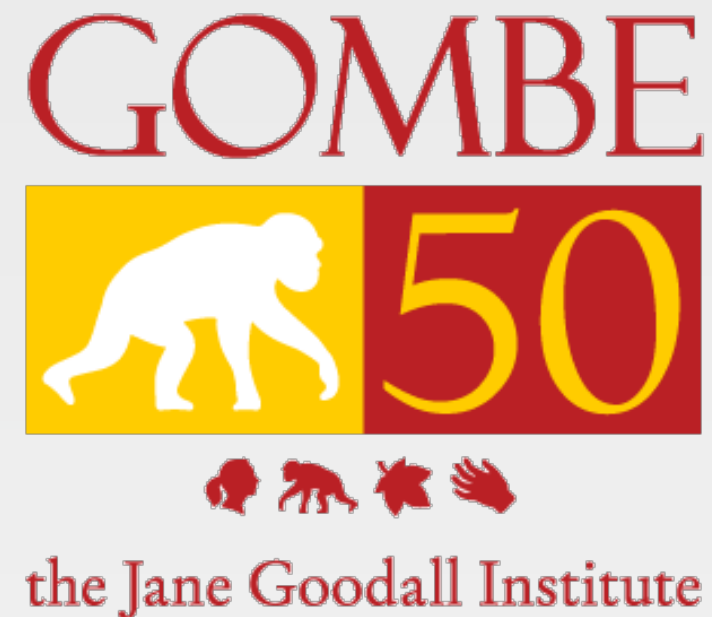
This reminds me of Rachel Carson because they are both woman scientists.

My Change Maker is connected to... Rachel Carson because they both like animals and are scientists.

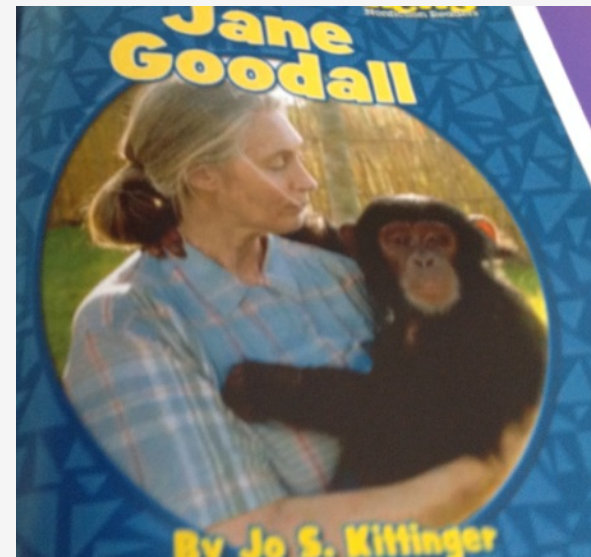
