

I think that not that many people treated him that badly after that. He proved his point.






#### Persevered

integrated.






# Impact: How Things are Different Today

I think he should've gotten into the Major Leagues sooner because he was better than some Major League players. Jackie Robinson also should've too because he was a good player.






#### Learned from Mistakes

I think he learned not to steal because he went to a reform school so he learned it wasn't right.









