

In 1944 when Jackie was in the army and he was sitting in the front of the bus and the driver said go to the back where you belong but Jackie said no and then they went to court.

This is a connection to Rosa Parks because she was also sitting in the front of a bus but there was a white man said go to the back but she refused.



Persevered

Jackie Robinson kept playing major league baseball even though people didn't want him to play baseball. In 1946 he was selected as Rookie of the Year and Jackie was so good that he became a Hall of Fame baseball player.

This would make me feel very happy if all of my hard work paid off, but I would also be sad if people were judging me by my skin color.



Impact: How Things are Different Today

In April 1947 he became the first black person in the major leagues, and he was on the Brooklyn Dodgers.

I would feel really good about myself because I was the one who fought for equal rights. I helped black people and was a hero.







